From the Principal

Family and Friends of the Port Curtis Road State School Community

Well this term has gone so quickly. The temperatures are certainly rising and the hot summer days are already here. Students are reminded to bring a water bottle each day to school.

We will begin **Swimming** next term, every Friday. Week 1 to 5: Years 5, 6 and 7 will be swimming and then Preps, Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 will swim from Weeks 6 to 10. A bus will transport students whether they are swimming or not. We do not have sufficient staff for non-swimmers to stay at school. All students will be transported to the Gracemere Pool from 11.30am - 1.30pm. Cost is \$6 per student. You may choose to pay each week or you can pay in full \$30 for the term. All students will be required to pay for swimming even if they are absent to help with the cost of the bus.

Students must wear a sunsmart shirt and long hair needs to be tied securely. Can you please ensure that all clothing is named?

There are a lot of students without sunsafe hats. Please note that caps are unacceptable and they not part of our Sunsmart Policy and all students must wear a wide brimmed hat. Party hats are available at school for \$15 each.

Attendance

If your child is away from school you need to notify the school via telephone or email by 9.30am. If no contact is made to the school, it is then necessary for the school to make contact with the parents. Police Visit

Last Tuesday, Constable Jeremy White visited the school. Jeremy spoke to the children about many interesting things. They discussed the role of police officers and stated that one of their main roles is to keep people safe, especially children. He also spoke about the importance of having a network of five safe people to tell if there is a problem. The children were also lucky enough to look at items such as a vest, a torch, and even a pair of handcuffs! You will be glad to know that Mrs O'Brien was only handcuffed for a short while! Children even had a look through the police car and practiced using breathalyser. Sirens were sounded and all children left with massive smiles on their faces.

Jeremy would also like to let parents know that it's the law for all children up to seven years of age to be correctly restrained according to their size and age. It is important that the correct child restraint is chosen and installed. The penalty for incorrectly securing a child is A\$330 and three demerit points.

Also, smoking in cars carrying children under the age of 16 years in Queensland is banned. Police are enforcing this law, and anyone caught smoking in a vehicle where a child is present will be issued with an on-the-spot fine of \$200.
